I would like to take this opportunity to contact you with regard to S.6257-A, referenced above, and to urge the Governor to sign this measure into law. This legislation authorizes the establishment of the Kingston Library District in the city of Kingston, Ulster County.

Pursuant to its provisions, S.6257-A provides the authority for the formation of a public library district which will consist of the city of Kingston. The formation of this district is subject to a public referendum which will take place on June 6, 2000. At that time, the district must be approved by a majority vote of the qualified voters of the City. Thus, this legislation will provide the resident voters of the city of Kingston with the opportunity to determine whether or not they want to permanently fund a community based library.

This proposal was requested by the board of trustees of the existing Kingston Library and by the Common Council of the City of Kingston (Resolution No.222 of 1999). The establishment of the Kingston Library District is vital for the continued improvement and advancement of the educational needs of the residents of Kingston.

In light of the foregoing, I respectfully request that the Governor act favorably on this proposal. Thank you for your consideration of this legislation. If you should have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:

This bill would establish a library district in the City of Kingston, Ulster County. The bill provides for approval by the voters of the City of Kingston in the process of establishing the district. It further provides for the election of the board members, organization and structure, and taxing and financing of the new district.

The State Education Department supports this bill, which was requested by the Board of Trustees of the existing Kingston Library and by the City of Kingston. Libraries that have public votes on their budgets and which elect their library trustees are usually funded at a higher level and are more accountable to the public than libraries that do not have public votes. This legislation should bring improved library service for the people of the City of Kingston.

WHEREAS, one such option involves the creation of a special taxing district; and

WHEREAS, before such a tax district can be created by the New York State Legislature, the City of Kingston must waive its Home Rule authority; and

WHEREAS, to encourage voter turnout, the City of Kingston recommends that no less than 4 polling places be established for this vote; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that the Kingston City Clerk be the Clerk of the election; and WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Kingston to waive its Home Rule authority on the issue of establishing a special taxing district for the Kingston Library.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KINGSTON, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION-1. That the City of Kingston hereby waives its Home Rule authority on the issue of creating a special tax district for the Kingston Library.

SECTION-2. That the City of Kingston hereby requests that the New York State Legislature enact legislation for submission by referendum on the question of whether a special library tax district should be created for the Kingston Library.

SECTION-3. That the initial budget for the Kingston Library shall not exceed \$350,000.

SECTION-4. That this resolution shall take effect immediately.
