1, Date of enlistment-	May 7, 1918.
2, Camp to which sent-	Paris Island, S.C.
3, Unit to which belonged-	32nd CO. Marines, 8th Regiment.
4, Date of trip overseas-	Aug. 9, 1918, left New York on U.S.S. Von Steuben.
5, Service there-	
a, Character-	Infantry. Later, 1st Coblenz bridge head river patrol.
b, Location-	Trained at Chatillon sur Cher, Champagne Sector, Aisne, Coblenz, Germany, in American Army of Occupation.
c, Battles-	Aisne-Marne. Oct. 10, to Nov. 11, 1918.
d, Experiences-	Boat cut in two by French steamer when on way to camp, carried back to New York and put on second boat. In crossing ocean attempts were made to torpedo the Von Steuben twice, but unsuccessfully.
e, Photograph-	2 enclosed, self and camp.
6, Return and Demobilization-	Aug. 9, 1919 arrived in New York on the Princess Vilhelmine sent to Camp Mills Long Island, Thence after parade in New York, to Quantico Va. In his parade in Washington, Aug. 15, Discharged, Aug. 17, 1919.

Biography of James J. Funicello, a Marine. He enlisted on May 7, 1918 and was discharged on August 13, 1919.
