# **Cortland's Stamp Selling Letter**

You have expressed so much interest in patriotic endeavors of the schools that I am sure you will be interested to know that in five weeks our high school, primary and intermediate departments sold \$6000 worth of Thrift Stamps.

One eighth grade girl, Lillian Allcock, sold
Thrift Stamps to the value of \$1223.75. An eighth
grade of eighteen children sold stamps amounting to
\$1098.25. A little fourth grade of twenty children
sold stamps to the value of \$323. The children
are so pleased with the results that I have informed
them that I should send photographs to you. They
