
Luxor, Egypt - Colossal Statue of Rameses II Court of Rameses II, Temple of Luxor, about 1896

It is surrounded by pillars decorated with artwork and hieroglypics. The city of Luxor is home to several important archeological sites, including the temples of Luxor and Karnak and the burial sites known as the Valley of the Kings and the Valley of the Queens, (1896).
