Reynolds' family car near King Hendrick Spring, outside Lake George in the Adirondack Mountains. The natural spring was named for a Mohawk Chief who was killed near the site of the spring in 1755 while aiding Sir William Johnson. The spring was used by local residents as a source of drinking water.
