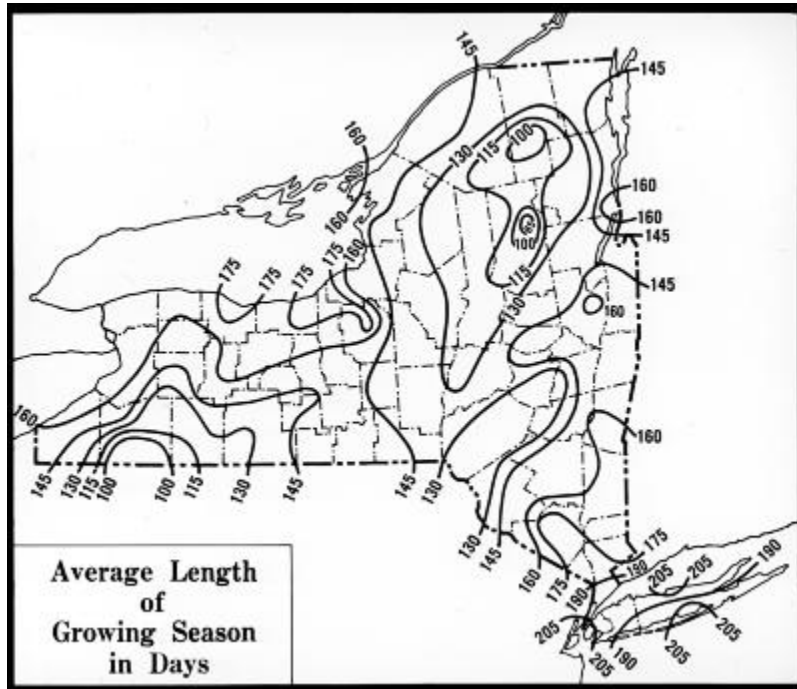


## Map of New York State Showing Average Number of Days between Last Frost in Spring and First in Fall.



Map of New York State dividing the state according to the average length of the growing season, which is measured in days between the last frost in the spring and the first frost in the fall. The longest growing seasons are located along the Great Lakes and the Atlantic Ocean, while the shortest growing seasons occur in the Adirondack and Allegheny Mountains. A note on the lantern slide indicates that the image was taken from Bulletin No. 316, 1912, Cornell University Agricultural Experiment Station.
