P.S.1 Manhattan PARADES CONTINUED PLAC DAY 1917 A navor-to-be-forgotten day for the Eindorgarten and first year pupile of P.W.1 Manhattan! THEIR PIRCY PARADE ! Even the sun beamed as the 400 happy children marched proudly down the school steps to the side walk. The drummer by "headed the procession a huge brown fur muff on her head, held in place by a red band under her chin. Her drum was beaten in perfect time. "USGLE SAE", the tellest girl, was accompanied by "LIBRETY" on one side and a dainty little RED GROSS nurse on the other. Three American Indians, fine in war paint (colored chalk) and feethered hend dress (made by the children themselves) followed with dignity. The nine divisions were all dressed in white. Each division were either red , white or blue ribbons. Some classes had spoulettes and others mashes of our national colors. The limof march was thru the neighborhood streets, cicling the school block twice. The children many simple patrictic airs as they marched. In front of the school, the parade came to a halt and at a signal f forced the entrance, where stood members of the school staff. 83 pupils held sloft the national flags at the head of the school steps. Every one saluted the flag and even the on-lookers joined in sing-So ended a happy experience for these little people, and in days to come they may tell of "Mother's First Parade".
