American Defense Society Letter, December 4, 1917

Dear Dick:

I have just got back from the Bouth, and find your letter of Movember 28th, emclosing the list of current periodicals and nowneavers in the New York Public Library. I will take the matter up with the people in Albamy and machington within the next few days and report to you.

As I look through the list, there are two or three untters that I think I can help you on at once. You have marked in this list as "acditious". The November 18th editor of "Therrhody's Morading", who where 18th editor of "Therrhody's Morading", help Theeler, is doing the best be can to help on the war. He has been to Albamy and asked the Governor to advise him as to what was the best material to put in the paper to help on the cause. He is on a consistee to help sell the Liberty Loun through magazines at the present moment.

Charles Hanson Towne, editor of McClure's Magazine, is the Chairman of the Magazine Editors Liberty Loun Countities; is a member of THE VII LLANTES; constantly writing patriotic material for nothing, and as much of on enthusiants as you and I are in favor of the war.

"The Mineteenth Century and After" is a British publication.

"The Now Reunblic" has charged since last April. I feel that now it is, in its peculiar way, supporting the country.

The paper called "The Matherland" has been suppressed once or twice, and I thought it had now changed its mame or gone out of emistence. I will, however, look this up. Regarding the others, I will write you later.
