

[Telegram from Governor Edwin D. Morgan to Abraham Lincoln]

Albany May 27 1861
His Excellency
Abraham Lincoln
Washington D.C.
Colonel Carr, Durfee,
Remix and others for regiments
were last week sent to Fortress
Monroe. I yesterday directed
five other regiments to be sent to
Fortress Monroe and four to Washington.
Yesterday I was sent by War Committee.
There are more for what you
expected from the War Committee,
and the 1st ordered by the General in-
Chief and the nineteenth instant to be
sent by the Governor to Washington

Telegram from Edwin D. Morgan, Governor of New York, to President Abraham Lincoln, 1861. Morgan advised Lincoln of where he had directed several regiments of New York troops to proceed to as they left the state. The letter is partially faded.
