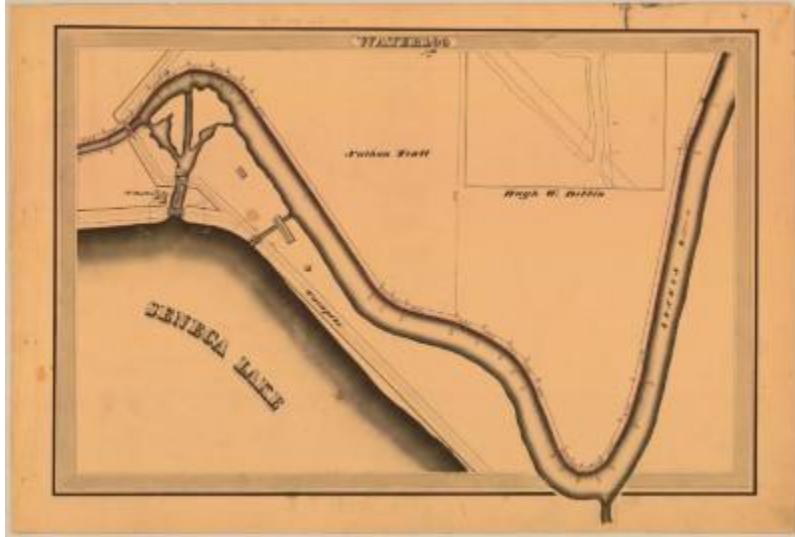


Cayuga and Seneca Canal Survey, Waterloo showing Canal Outlets and Seneca lake
