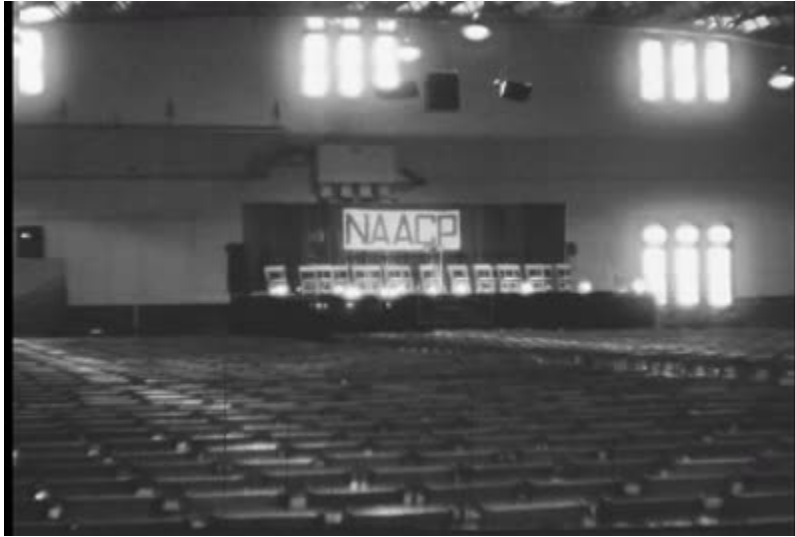


Civil Rights Demonstration, 1964
