Fort Crailo, stone loop and memorial tablet



This imposing brick structure is known as Fort Crailo. During the 18th century it acted as a headquarters for the vast Rensselaer Estate. The earliest date of residence is in 1704 by Hendrick van Rensselaer, though it may have been built in 1642 as the sign states. Its reinforced structure is a legacy of a time when Indian raids were a threat, and the hole in the stone beneath the sign is likely a gun port. According to legend, at this site in 1758 British Army surgeon Richard Shuckburgh penned the lyrics of "Yankee Doodle" to mock the Colonial Troops he saw in the area. This image was created to record the historic site activities of the New York State Conservation Department.
