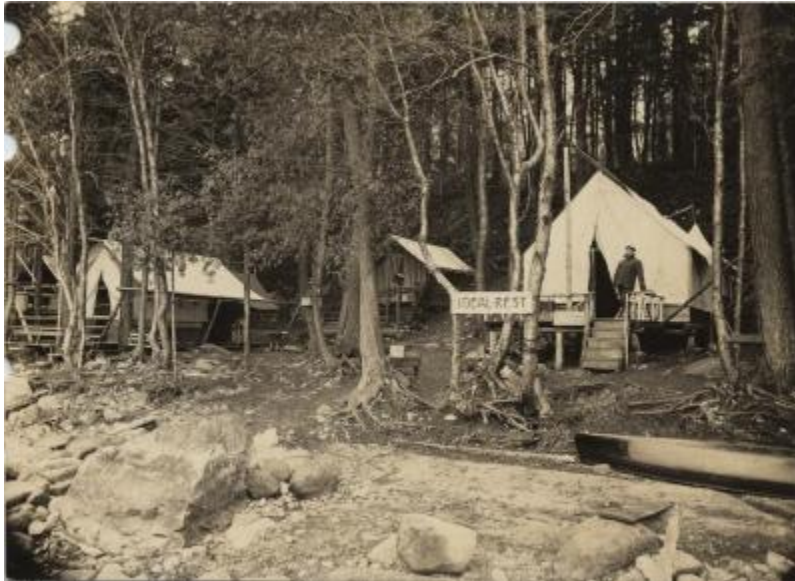


## Tent platform, permit No. 34 on South side of Lower Saranac Lake



Campsite consisting of three tents erected platforms on the shores of Lower Saranac Lake in the Adirondack Mountains.
