
"Westchester School Wins National Prize for 1918 W. S. S. Sales"



The Westchester County War Savings Committee announces that the Quaker Ridge School of New Rochelle received the bronze tablet offered by Miss Mary C. C. Bradford. State Superintendent of Public Instruction of Colorado, to the school in the United States showing the largest per capita purchase of War Savings Stamps during the year 1917—1918.

Miss Etta B. Tryon was in charge of the school when the medal was awarded. The Quaker Ridge is a small public school in New Rochelle, but the pupils were enthusiastic War Savers and piled up a per capita of \$305. It is no small honor to have had the largest per capita sales in the entire Country.

When Miss Bradford asked for reports of sales she said "I am asking because I wish to award the bronze tablet offered by me as the 1917—1918 Prez. of the National Education Ass'n as a recognition of the patriotic service of the school children in cooperating with this financial enterprise of the Government during War times."

An article announcing that Quaker Ridge School in New Rochelle, N.Y. was awarded a bronze tablet by Miss Mary C. C. Bradford, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction of Colorado for selling the most War Savings Stamps in the country during the 1917-1918 school year.
