I have never succeeded wall with a crop of potatoes on soil, crop'd the previe year, however much cours may have been but on the same sesson, particularly Smilling the samure in the furrows on bills, when planty of rain, the wines may growled and, but the first dry easther will ever soon till the vines, at least so has been the result all my experiments in this way- you will possit so for this observe, in reference to the introduction of this potato, that I have reason to believe their has been no agricultural paper, or other periodical mublished in this Country, that has aution the teportation of the Roben Patets in this time except wix of the Roben Pointo, brought from france by a gentlessa of Albany late in the full, or fore part of the winter 1837- Judge Buil showed me two of these six cotatoes, last Fabry when on a wisit at his house- A gave me the above account of thes, expling the two potations were presented him by this gentleman (MT. VT.
