American Defense Society Letter, December 4, 1917

New York, December 4, 1917.

Dear Dick:

I have just got back from the South, and find your letter of Hovember 28th, ecclosing the list of current periodicals and novapapers in the New York Public Library. I will take the matter up with the people in Albany and Mashington within the next few days and report to you.

As I look through the list, there are two or three matters that I think I can help you on at once. You have marked in this list as "seditious", "morrhead's Macasina", "McGlaus's Macasina", "The New Macashie" and "The Mineteenth Contary", among others. The ditor of "<u>Twaryhody's Macasins</u>", MrW Macaler, is doing the best he can to help on the war. We has been to ilhany and asked the Governor to advise him as to what was the best material to put in the paper to help on the cause. He is on a constitue to help sell the Liberty Loan through magazines at the present macast.

Charles Hanson Towne, oditor of <u>McDure's Mensing</u>, is the Chairman of the Magnaime Dittors Liberty Losn Committee; is a member of THE VILLANESS, constantly writing patriotic mothing, and as much of an enthusiast as you and 1 are in favor of the war. There is no question, whatever, as to the loyalty of these two magasines.

"The Mineteenth Century and After" is a British publication.

"The New Reughlic" has charged since last April. I feel that new it is, in its peculiar way, supporting the country.

The paper called "<u>The Retherland</u>" has been suppressed once or twice, and I thought it had now changed its mame or gone out of existence. I will, however, look this up. Hagarding the others, I will write you later.
