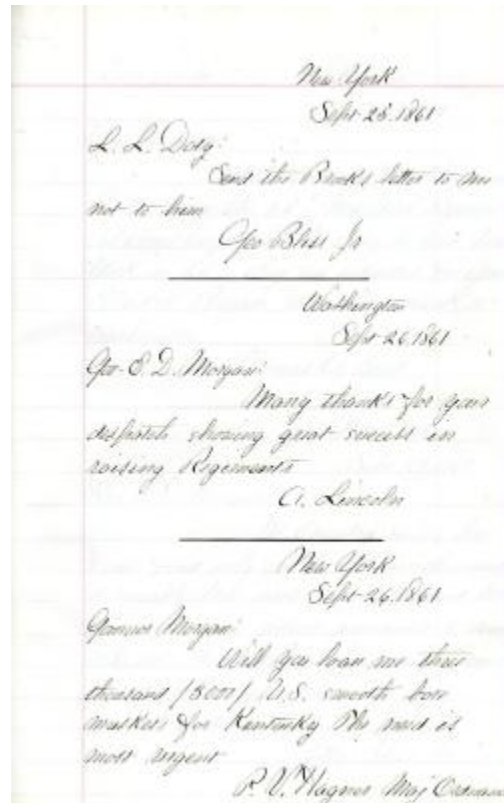


[Transcript, Telegram from Abraham Lincoln to Governor Morgan, 1861]



Transcript of a telegram sent from President Abraham Lincoln to Edwin D. Morgan, Governor of New York, in 1861. Lincoln thanked Morgan for his assistance in raising soldiers for the Union Army, lauding his "great success".;Other transcripts on this page include a telegram from George Bliss, Jr. to Lockwood Doty, the head of New York's Bureau of Military Statistics, and a telegram from R.V. Hagner to Governor Morgan, requesting muskets for use in Kentucky.
