

"White List" of Hawks That Aid Conservation



Painting by the ornithological artist Louis Agassiz Fuertes (1874-1927) depicting hawks that supposedly aid conservation efforts. From top left they are: Red-tailed hawk (*Buteo jamaicensis*), Red-shouldered hawk (*Buteo lineatus*), Broad-winged hawk (*Buteo platypterus*), Marsh hawk (a.k.a. Northern harrier, *Circus cyaneus*), Sparrow hawk (a.k.a. American kestrel, *Falco sparverius*), and an unidentified hawk. For each species an adult and a juvenile are depicted. This image was created to record the game bird activities of the New York State Conservation Commission.
