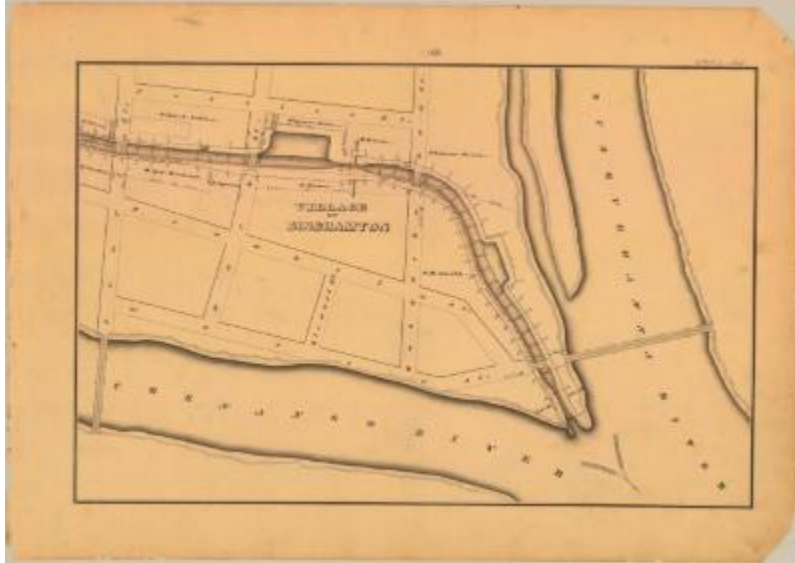


Chenango Canal Survey, showing Village of Binghamton, Lock No. 113, 114 and the junction of the Susquehanna and Chenango Rivers



This is an ink, wash and charcoal map of a section of the Chenango Canal in Chenango. It shows the Village of Binghamton, the junction of the Chenango and Susquehanna Rivers, the end of the canal, two rectangle shaped basins, Lock No. 113 and 114, six bridges including two that span the Chenango River and the Susquehanna River, three buildings, Collier Street, Franklin Street, Water Street, Susquehanna Street, Park Street and Court Street. The red lines indicate courses and distances. The blue lines indicate canal right-of-way. The map also shows the properties of McKinney, Elihu Ely, John A. Collier, H. and A. Birdsall, J. Squires, Thomas Evans, J. Evans and J.D Smith.

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
