The "boys" from Civilian Conservation Corps camp S-92 are building a waterhole, digging out the soil and lining the pit with stone. When complete, the waterhole will aid fire suppression efforts. The CCC camp S-92 was located near Almond, N.Y. and operated from 1934-1942. This image was created to record the reforestation work of the Civilian Conservation Corps under the supervision of the New York State Conservation Department.
