The peculiar layering effect of the forest in the distance shows the effects of regular systematic cutting. The trees to the left of the image are the youngest, getting older as you head right. Finally, at the right edge of the image, the oldest trees are clear cut. Cutting proceeds east towards west. Representatives from the department of conservation toured this forest in order to study forest management methods. This image was created to record the agricultural and forestry studies performed by the New York State Conservation Department.
