IRVING C. MAGHRAN, JR., an attorney duly admitted to practice in the State of New York and before this Court, under penalty of perjury, affirms as follows:

1. That I am the attorney for the defendant, ERNE FRENZ, in the above action and make this affirmation in response to the plaintiffs' motion relating to procedure and scheduling of trials for plaintiffs' reperial damages.

2. That I am strongly opposed to the proposal of class counsel that four trials be held to determine the reperial damages of 80 plaintiffs and such results be used to determine damages for all plaintiffs who suffered reperial. I also object to the contention that such trials include awards for both punitive and compensatory damages and that it is proper or necessary that reperial damage trials involve evidence before the jury of "the entire picture of what went on at Attica that day". I also take issue with class counsel's assertion in her affirmation of February 3, 1984 that all plaintiffs suffered a "complexity of experiences".
