AFFIRMATION OF MARYLOU K. ROSHIA

I, MARYLOU K. ROSHIA, make this affirmation in support of the attached Motion and further state:

1. On Thursday, February 6, 1992, I contacted several members from the Al-Jundi, et al. v. Spock et al. jury. Two of the jurors spoke with me under the condition that I not reveal their names and I agreed to this request.
2. One of the jurors, hereinafter referred to as "Juror X," stated that at least three jurors were reading accounts of the Attica trial in the newspaper and watching television news programs concerning the trial on a daily basis. This statement is supported by an article published in The Buffalo Evening News on February 6, 1992 attached hereto as Exhibit A.
3. Juror X also told me that approximately one month into the trial jurors sent a note to Judge Ellis informing him of the fact that the three jurors were reading the newspaper and that they refused to stop doing so at the request of the other jurors.
