Jailhouse lawyer reveals at 'victory' in Attica trial

Verdict against ex-official cheers attorney

Jerome Rosenberg said in a telephone interview from the West Side Commercial Building in Attica "I'm extremely pleased that the jury has ruled in favor of the people who were wronged by the U.S. Justice Dept. during the Attica uprising and that the jury has held the U.S. Justice Dept. responsible for the deaths and injuries to several innocent people."

Today, the 20th day of the trial, Rosenberg, one of the Attica prisoners in the prison who fought the battle, probably was more emotional than his usual self.

To Rosenberg, the Attica uprising and the trial were a long struggle for the people who were wronged by the U.S. Justice Dept. during the Attica uprising and that the jury has held the U.S. Justice Dept. responsible for the deaths and injuries to several innocent people.
