That, both groups suffered. Of the 43 people killed during the riot or the running of the prison, 12 were Attica employees, and in 1971, they were killed by state police bullets.

Following hearings to strategize as well as the fact in the 30-year-old case is a good step. However, the state will resist determination if the inmates who gave up their right to sue by accepting death benefits were wronged. If so, that wrong must be put right.

At Tishman said, justice is due both sides.
