Parole inmate to appeal rejected parole bid

Rights lawyer says judge issued 'off the wall' ruling with 'no justice'

berg to be released from

Gen. Rosenberg told the judge he was
subjected to rape as part of his con-
tinuing fight to get out of jail before he
died of severe heart and liver problems.
In his decision, Rossett noted the
State Parole Board's latest denial of pa-
role to Rosenberg, 36, on March 15,
1994, was proper.
Rosenberg was sentenced to death
after his conviction in the 1957 slaying
of two Brooklyn police officers, but in
1963 his sentence was commuted to life
in prison. Rosenberg, currently an in-
mate at the Alton State Correctional
Facility, could not be reached for com-
ment.
He has consistently maintained that
he didn't shoot either officer. He claims
his brother-in-law, who died in prison
years ago, shot both men.
In his ruling, Rossett agreed with

Attorney General Charles W.
Burr D. Loughran that Rosenberg could
be filing a writ of habeas corpus instead
of a so-called Article 78 proceeding.
But Rossett also noted that even if
Rosenberg had used the correct legal
strategy against the Parole Board, he
still would have lost the case.
The record of the Parole Board's
last proceeding against Rosenberg
shows that the board considered all the
legally "necessary statutory factors" in
denying parole once again, Rossett
noted.
He noted that the Parole Board's an-
nouncement did not state "in the least of in-
sulting or impugning" that
would justify Rosenberg's immediate re-
lease from prison.
