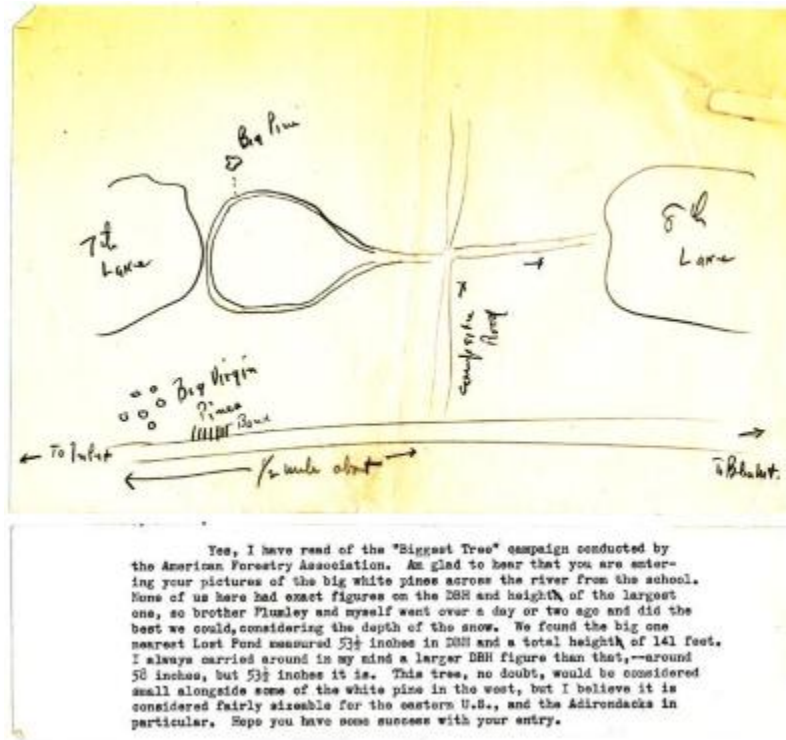


Letter pertaining to the "Biggest Tree" campaign
