Minority report and recommendations of the Governor's Commission appointed to review the State's abortion law

TETRODUCTION AND SUMMARY.

Our afterity statement is concerned only with the expended grounds for legalized electics proposed by the sejurity of our Conmittee. We have not separately stated our position on the proposed procedures.

We agree with the majority that a legal abortion should continue to be evailable if oncennery to preserve the life of the pregnant woman.

Konsigner McManus and Professor Hyrn oppose legalized abortion in the case of maps in the first degree; in view of the procedural safeguards in the proposal, and based on his optimion that such a proposal is consistent with the best interests of the people of the State of New York, Dr. Harrison does not oppose it. All three of us recognize that this ground for abortion is essentially different true the reaginder of the majority's proposels, and presents special and difficult problems.

We dissent from all those of the remainder of the majority's proposals which suggest additional grounds for legalized sportion.

We have stated extensively the restors for our distent because we believe that as menders of a Srudy Committee, it was our obligation <u>first</u>, to explore asrefully and throughtfully all the ramifications of the problem so that the best interests of the people of the State of New York might be warved, and <u>second</u>, to expound in detail the results of our deliberations.
